In-school barriers

- Lower ability pupils who are eligible for PP who are making less progress than middle and higher ability pupils at Key Stage 1
- A number of PP premium pupils have SEND and mental health needs which may impact on academic progress.
- Low levels of resilience for some pupils (including those eligible for PP).

External barriers

- Parenting capacity: lack of routine, sleep, food and homework
- Some low income families find it hard to afford extra enrichment activities.
